Overall Feedback

Introduction Paragraph:

- The introduction touches on the main topic but **lacks a clear thesis statement**. It needs a stronger opening to effectively set the context and purpose of the essay.
- Suggestion: **Start with a hook** to engage the reader and **clearly state the thesis**, outlining the main arguments of the essay, following the format provided in the handout.

Body Paragraphs:

- The body paragraphs present some arguments but **lack depth and clarity in their development**. The points made are somewhat **repetitive** and need better organization and support.
- Suggestion: Use **clear topic sentences for each paragraph** and develop each point with specific examples and explanations. Ensure each paragraph **focuses on a unique aspect of the argument**.

Concluding Paragraph:

- The conclusion summarizes the main points but does **not effectively restate the thesis** or offer a strong final thought. **It introduces new ideas, which is not recommended.**
- Suggestion: Follow the conclusion structure outlined in the handout – restate the main idea, make a prediction or recommendation, and avoid introducing new arguments.
